

## ANIMAL INSTINCT / INSTINCT ANIMAL 13.10.2023 - 25.02.2024

Why do turtles rush to the sea as soon as they leave their nests, and spiders spontaneously weave webs? Mysterious, imperceptible and fascinating, the animal instinct has always stirred the curiosity of artists.

The MBAL is delighted to present the collective exhibition animal instinct / instinct animal, which offers an atypical journey into the animal condition. Through an original dialogue between masterpieces from the animal collection of the MBAL and MUZOO, La Chaux-de-Fonds, and a selection of works by invited contemporary artists, the exhibition explores the blurred boundaries between the innate and the acquired, wilderness and domesticity, nature and culture, submission and freedom, science and fiction.

The journey begins close to the sky on the 3rd floor, where a few bees hovering, not knowing where to go. Inspired by the book Les merveilles de l'instinct chez les insectes by naturalist Jean-Henri Casimir Fabre (1914), the MBAL invited the Swiss collective APIAN to present a new site-specific installation combining videos, documents and artifacts on the behavior of bees, disrupted by pesticides.

On the 2nd floor, in the footsteps of Jorge Luis Borges' imaginary beings, artist Irène Grundel's intriguing blue bird, made of wood, plaster and wax, dominates the room and turns into a furry structure, which contains a cabinet of curiosities. These real and dreamlike creatures from the museums' collections, including works by Chagall, Le Corbusier and Hainard, as well as wonders of modern Inuit art, mingle with Pamela Rosenkranz's snake symbolism and the technological unconscious of Emilio Vavarella's animal filmakers.

The exhibition continues with Patrick Goddard, who invites us to share a conversation with his philosophical dog, endowed with more reason than instinct. Taxidermy in Gaza's bombed-



out zoos as a desperate solution to war resistance is at the heart of Roman Selim Khereddine's video piece.

Assembled by Marta Bogdańska on the 1st floor, photographic archives of animals exploited by the army and their revolt explore the relationship of domination between human beings and animals and mingles with MBAL's permanent collection.

On the ground floor, science, experience and fiction come together in two fascinating projects: a video by BE-AR(T) collective presents an anti-human repellent for bears, while animals from the MUZOO's zoo unveil the results of their artistic workshop with their caregivers.

In the Marie-Anne Calame room, children express themselves and reflect on three top predators: the lynx, the wolf and the bear, in collaboration with the Swiss magazine *La Salamandre*.
